



Data Privacy Policy

This privacy policy sets out how the Save Childhood Movement (SCM) collects and uses any information you may give us when you visit our websites, as well as how we may disclose that information, and how you can control the collection, correction and/or deletion of that information.

Your privacy is our priority and we go to great lengths to protect it. Any information we collect about you will always be handled securely and in compliance with the UK Data Protection Act (1998) and all other relevant legislation.

What information do we collect?

We may collect, store and use two kinds of data: personal and log information.

Personal data is any information you provide that enables you to support our activities and includes your name, address, email address and post code. This also includes information about any donations you might make or advocacy actions you may take part in.

This includes where you might "follow", "like" or otherwise link your social media accounts to the campaign via a third-party website. Any correspondence you send electronically may be retained, such as the content of your email messages, your email address and our response.

Your personal log information relates to information about your visit to, and any actions on, this website. This includes your IP address, referrer, length of visit and number of page views. This information is required for the website to work correctly and allows us to improve the performance and functionality of the site.

We only collect the information that we need to fulfil the purposes set out at collection. You can update this information at any time.

How will we use your data?

The information you provide may be used to:

- keep you up to date with our activities
- offer you opportunities to engage with our activities;
- respond to your queries;
- process your application to volunteer;
- administer supporter records;
- conduct fundraising activities; and,
- operate, maintain, and provide to you the features and functionality of this website.

You may opt out from receiving such information at any time

Your personal data may be shared within the SCM community (i.e. between local, regional and national sub-groups), and with organisations and partners we have a strategic relationship with. In every instance these organisations and partners will only be supplied with the minimum amount of personal data they need to fulfil the services we request. They are obligated to protect your data in accordance with our policies. As part of that sharing we require our partners to never publish your personal details without your consent, and we do not pass your personal details to third parties.

The Save Childhood Movement uses the NationBuilder web platform to organise its community of member supporters and volunteers. We may be required to disclose information by law or court order.

For clarity, personal data will never be rented or sold to others.

Cookies

Cookies are small text files placed on your device when you visit our website. They allow us to make the website easier to use, to provide you with a more personalised experience, to guard against malicious activities and to ensure any login feature functions correctly. They do not collect personal information about you.

You can remove or block cookies by changing the settings in your browser, but the functionality of the website may be adversely affected.

By using our websites, you are consenting to our use of cookies in accordance with this notice. If you do not agree to our use of cookies then we advise you to set your browser settings accordingly.

Data Transfers

In the event of closure of the movement, the Movement will authorise the complete destruction of its database, as soon as is reasonably practicable Data will not be retained or transferred to any successor organisation without full disclosure to the members.
